Children's Ministry Report

As Jesus spoke, "Let the children come to me." Children's Sunday school, Vacation Bible School and other children events provide children the great gift of developing a relationship with Jesus Christ and learning how to live more like Jesus Christ in a safe and nurturing environment. Our dedicated teachers and helpers help children discover who God is and who God wants them to become.

Children's Sunday school serves children, Kindergarten-5^{th grade}

Vacation Bible School serves children, Preschool-5th grade

Last fall, April Patek was hired part-time as Christian Education Director for youth and children. **CURRICULUM**

At this time, the Sunday school and Children's message was restarted after a summer hiatus. The Curriculum was the "One Room Sunday School" that had been chosen by Mark Gatsakos and Pastor Lee to combine all students in one classroom. In January, Cheryl Fournier and I found that the older children were not being challenged enough and so we split the older and younger children most weeks. During Lent, we followed "The Way" lessons just as the whole church was. Unlike the previous summer, we decided to continue Sunday school but with an open curriculum inviting teachers to share different interests with the children.

This year we have a new curriculum that follows the lectionary. The children in Sunday school will be presented with the same scripture that the adults will be hearing in worship. This will make it easier for families to have follow-up conversations with their children for they have now learned the same material. The students have papers to take home each week showing what they have learned and suggesting activities they can do the rest of the week.

<u>VBS</u>

Julie Kukreja and April worked hard together to make an awesome experience for our church and community children. The theme/curriculum was Kingdom Rock where children learned to stand strong for God. Julie and her helpers transformed the church into a castle. We had 30+ adult and youth volunteers during the week and even more adults that donated food and other items. We had a celebration Friday night and cheered on our youth knights. On Sunday following, we turned worship service into a VBS experience and twelve children including non-church members came back to sing for the congregation. After worship, the whole congregation feasted on chicken and corn (Renaissance style), played games and jumped in the bouncy castle. We are already talking about next year's theme and will be announcing it soon.

CREATING A CHILDREN FRIENDLY SPACE

The Sunday school room was a bit drab and industrial. With the blessing of Trustees, and the generous donation of paint from an anonymous donor and Julie Kukreja's donation of her time and talents, we transformed the room in time for the beginning of Sunday school (with some added details to come). We painted the entire double room a new base coat and added a fun stripe border along the ceiling. We added new bulletin and dry erase boards. Julie created the most beautiful and large world mural including many cultural icons as well as other maps around the room. The children created hot air balloons (paper mache and decoupage) to hang from the ceiling. In the media corner, we added a children's floor rug and giant bean bag pillows. The children loved it immediately and experienced how

much we value them. Many thanks to Julie for such a wonderful job!

OTHER ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND ACTIVITIES

... Taught and experienced elements of worship such as prayer and communion and created a dedicated prayer space for children.

...After a very successful Bethlehem Market, which was run by Janet Kleckner, April wrote and directed a children's nativity for the following Sunday's worship. All children had a costumed part and sang several songs after they acted out the drama.

...Children's music—children sang and played bells for worship.

...Began children and youth acolyte (candle lighting)

...Participated in Firefighter Appreciation Sunday and received a tour of fire station

Mission Team Report

Algonquin/Lake in the Hills Food Pantry – Super Bowl Sunday/February 2, we did a special collection of food for the pantry. 148 lbs. of food was collected.

PADS (Public Action To Deliver Shelter) – March 2, we supplied a dinner for about 50 homeless guests. Dessert was provided by the Youth group.

Loose Change Jar – Money collected went into the General Fund.

School Tool Box Program – The month of April we collected \$1290.00. 43 children from Perry School in Carpentersville, were able to get a back pack filled with school supplies.

TLS Veterans – The month of April we collected 200 canned items & sent a check for \$115.00 for the Veterans food pantry in McHenry.

UMCOR/Church World Services – During April & part of May, we collected 69 packages of combs for the health/hygiene kits. The kits were assembled at the annual Conference in June.

Jewel Food Drives – We had two food drives for the Algonquin/Lake in the Hills Food Pantry. May 11 collected 383 lbs. of food & \$76.28. September 7 collected 10 shopping carts filled with food & \$198.63. Food Collection - At our church daily for the Algonquin/Lake in the Hills Food Pantry.

Rummage Sale – June 20 we had a rummage sale at our church. We collected \$1084.00, that went into the General Fund. The items that did not sell were donated to Am-Vets.

CARDUNAL CROP Walk – October 20 we hosted the walk. 75% of donations collected will go to Church World Services & the other 25% of donations collected will be divided between Algonquin/Lake in the Hills Food Pantry, Fish Food Pantry & PADS Shelter.

ADOPTA PLATOON – During the month of October we will collect Thanksgiving cards for the soldiers. The cards will get mailed the beginning of November. During the month of November we will collect Christmas cards for the soldiers. The cards will get mailed the beginning of December.

Holiday Gift Program – The month of November we will collect gifts for a mother & her children at Home of the Sparrow. We will also collect miscellaneous items for the shelter.

Lord, thank you for the talents & skills you give us to use in serving others.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

Helping Hands is the Prayer Shawl Ministry which provides a handmade shawl that has been prayed over, to our congregation, their family members, and friends and neighbors in our community during challenging times in their lives. A prayer card and a cross stitch bookmark with a Bible verse are included with each shawl. We've given out 25 shawls in 2013: 7 of those were given to Sherman Hospital. We've given 8 care boxes which contain small wrapped gifts to open every day during a difficult time of their

life.

We helped purchase outdoor banners for Vacation Bible School that was held in July. We make scarves and hats for the Mission Ministry in October.

We meet the second Monday of each month except July and December. We have 8 or 10 ladies attend as we work on our projects and have our meeting and a delicious food time. We are also thankful that we have a lady in Pennsylvania who makes shawls for us, and we have some ladies who make shawls but are unable to come to our meetings. For various reasons we've lost several ladies this year.

If you are interested in crocheting, knitting or cross stitching we would welcome anyone to join us. We will be happy to help you get started. The love of this church is far reaching and the Christ United Methodist Church flame shines around the world through the Prayer Shawl Ministry.

Public Relations

We are all saddened by the loss of Arlene Young. She was in the first class of Stephen Ministers at Christ Church and a Stephen Leader, and this ministry was very much a part of Arlene's life. She spent many years in the role of Stephen Minister to care receivers, provided guidance and support for fellow care givers and also taught and encouraged several groups of people to help them become Stephen Ministers. Stephen Bear, who attends our meetings, will help to carry on her Stephen Ministry legacy.

Stephen Ministers know that we offer only care-giving and that we leave the cure-giving to God. It is our privilege to serve God through this ministry.

We have Youth Education most Sundays during the 10:00 am service. Youth Explosion has meetings/outings about three times per month. There are 13 middle and high school youth that regularly attend our events and services.

Our numerous fun events that were held over the past year included Putt-Putt, a Super Bowl party, two overnight "lock ins", an overnight trip to a lake cottage, bowling, laser tag, and various events that involved food, movies and games.

And, with new leadership the ministry of Public Relations is helping in the area of communications both among us, as well as within the communities around us.

This coming November we are going to celebrate the 24th Church Anniversary. Twenty-Four years ago, people began worship service in the gymnasium of Crystal Lake High School. Nine years later, they went to the Northern Illinois Conference to borrow money to buy this property where our church building now stands all because of a vision to bring people to Christ. As we head toward celebrating our 25th Church Anniversary (a milestone in our church history), I boldly ask all members of the congregation to reclaim God's vision again in this community, now and in the future. Vision is not a destination or a full grown tree but a seed God has planted in the heart of faithful people. So let us prepare our hearts for that seed. That is my prayer for you who are here now, and for those who are not here as yet.
