Some time when the river is ice ask me mistakes I have made. Ask me whether what I have done is my life. Others have come in their slow way into my thought, and some have tried to help or to hurt: ask me what difference their strongest love or hate has made.

I will listen to what you say. You and I can turn and look at the silent river and wait. We know the current is there, hidden; and there are comings and goings from miles away that hold the stillness exactly before us. What the river says, that is what I say.

Do you know what you are meant to do and who you are meant to be? I remember one afternoon at a retreat home two years ago when I reflected on my ordained life in a small group conversation. I felt like I made it halfway, as I had completed 15 years of full-time pastoring by then. I shared my hope to serve more with God-given gifts for the second half of my pastoral leadership beyond the local church. I did not mean to live a busier life or "occupy myself with things too great for me," as the psalmist said (psalm 131). I meant to live my vocation not by my willfulness with ambitious goals to be this and do that but by listening to my life - "a life that is different from the "I" of daily consciousness; a life that is trying to live through the "I' who is its vessel," in Parker Palmer's words. We are more than our roles, titles, and daily activities. There is a true life waiting to be expressed and acknowledged within us, a life larger than ourselves.

Living through another season of coldness and long nights, I hope we remember the life sustained underneath the ground, the current flowing below the frozen river. In the harshness of winter, I hope we learn to be humble and know our limits and weaknesses. I hope we are not afraid to take a downward journey to see the darkness and brokenness in us and our world because, without that spiritual journey, we cannot find our way out to the light. I hope we discover that there is a hidden wholeness in all things. That whole life is what our loving creator gifted us, all of us, as our birthright.
